(c) both you and where relevant your sponsors/parents/partner/guardians must give consent to share your household income with the University. Your consent must be activated on your national Student Finance service account on or before 31 October 2025 ( 11. You must withdraw the entire available Bursary amount within 90 days of it becoming available to you in the Portal. Please note that if you do not do so, you will forfeit any amount that you did not withdraw. In addition, the University may cancel your Bursary award and you will forfeit any entitlement to future Bursary payments.

## What happens if you are allocated a Bursary but decide to: defer, transfer or intermit your place on a course?

12. If you are eligible for a Bursary and you subsequently decide to defer your place on your course you will no longer be eligible for the Bursary. A new assessment of your eligibility for the Bursary will be carried out when

household income as assessed by your Student Finance Service exceeds the qualifying level, you will no longer be eligible for the Bursary and you will no longer receive any further Bursary payments. However if this should occur please note that you will not be asked to re-pay to the University any Bursary payments previously made to you.

The University shall also be entitled to recover or adjust any Bursary given in error.

The University reserves the right, with reasonable cause, to exclude applicants from a course and/or withhold Bursaries for violating any of these Terms and/or any other applicable University policies or terms and conditions including (without limitation), the Student Terms and Conditions website at https://www.law.ac.uk/policies/.
- 23. The University reserves the right to amend these Terms at any time. Any amendments changes that affect you.
- 24. Even if the University delays in enforcing these Terms, the University can still enforce them later. If the University does not insist immediately that you do anything you are required to do under these Terms, or if the University delays in taking steps against you if you break these Terms, it will not mean that you do not have to do those things or prevent the University from taking steps against you at a later date.
